As St. Vincent de Paul Society members, together we help people—"strangers"—every day, whether by securing a roof over a homeless Veteran's head, or feeding a struggling family who is facing the pressures of unemployment. The people who come to us for help are often scared, but they quickly learn that they are never alone.

You see, our decades of service in Marin County have continually shown us that we are enveloped by your outpouring of generosity, compassion, and

commitment to people who you may never meet but nevertheless know your heart and your benevolence.

Achieving this goal took plenty of grit; working with Veterans and their unique challenges is not easy. And yet, this work also gave us the opportunity to share your grace because your generosity saved the lives of men and women who served our country and yet were sleeping on our streets.

MARIN'S ONLY FREE DINING ROOM SERVED 180,000 MEALS IN 2023

With perpetually rising grocery prices and other economic downturns, we have observed an increase in the diners we see daily. Among these children, families, and Veterans are an **uptick in older adults** who have never previously required our services but are now facing struggles due to living on a fixed income with rising prices. **Many are forced to choose between rent and food.** With the support of hundreds of compassionate volunteers, donors, and our warmhearted kitchen staff, we served more than **180,000** meals for our neighbors—that is almost **500 meals every single day.** No one should go to bed hungry.

PREVENTING HOMELESSNESS AND PROVIDING EMERGENCY AID

With the compassionate support of our generous benefactors, last year we distributed more than **\$1.1 million in rental assistance and other emergency direct aid** to hundreds of our vulnerable Marin neighbors struggling to make ends meet. Your acts of kindness and grace directly prevented countless evictions and provided families on the edge with a newfound sense of hope.

CONTINUED SUCCESS WITH ENDING HOMELESSNESS

St. Vincent de Paul's mission of ending hunger and homelessness in Marin paired with your belief in our team continues to produce remarkable results in every layer of our community. Your support has allowed **SVdP's Homeless Outreach Team (HOT)** to continue to work closely with the County of Marin and other local service providers to **house 726 chronically homeless people** since 2017, with a success rate of nearly 95% still permanently housed. In 2023, SVdP housed an additional **314 families, individuals, and Veterans through our Rapid Rehousing Program.** This achievement saves our community **millions annually**. Not only are we saving taxpayer money, but businesses, hospitals, and our clients thrive.

Creating Second Chances

You are helping us change lives every day.

St. Vincent de Paul's Sober Living Environment (SLE) Program, also known as permanent supportive housing, provides an opportunity for individuals who have experienced intense hardships related to drug misuse, mental health, and various health challenges to seek another chance. This program serves clients on Medi-Cal, those experiencing homelessness, and people newly graduated from detox or treatment and who are sober to gain financial assistance for moving into an SLE. For merely \$3,600 we can house an individual for three to four months while they work on their sobriety.

New Beginnings at St. Vincent de Paul

Greg was a high-functioning alcoholic for more than 40 years. This was his "normal" and went about life like many others—starting a family and thriving in the workforce.

At age 55, Greg finally decided things had to change. Initially reluctant at the idea of a sober living environment, thinking he could conquer his demons on his own, **Greg eventually found himself deeply rooted in the program and making a real change in his life.**

Greg spent a year in a local sober living environment where he conquered his addiction. Confident in his sobriety, Greg moved back into his regular living arrangement only to discover that he was still grappling with the vast challenges his mental health presented. He was struggling with regular panic attacks and took on an isolationist approach to the world, scared to venture outside his front door.

Working with his medical team, Greg found a treatment that worked for him and felt he

was finally in a place to find employment and start anew. Luckily for Greg, a friend from his sober living environment had the perfect role in mind—working for St. Vincent de Paul.

Armed with his resume, Greg came to our Free Dining Room and was welcomed with open arms as our new block ambassador **We believe in the dignity of all people at St.**Vincent de Paul and strongly believe that everyone deserves a second chance.

Once joining our team, Greg was also invited to partner with Matt, one of our compassionate case workers to help ensure his stability.

Matt was able to secure a permanent living situation for Greg, of which SVdP paid for the deposit and first month's rent.

Greg remains successfully housed and continues to thrive in his role as SVdP's very welcoming block ambassador. We are thrilled to have him on our team and are so proud of his success one day at a time.

Always in Your Corner

An increasingly common profile in our community, Sheri is an **older adult living in Marin who is dependent on others for basic needs.** She was struggling heavily with a variety of mental and physical ailments that severely impacted her will to live.

In combination with financial troubles, Sheri decided she had nothing to live for and would consequently cease treatment, allowing her medical conditions to take her life. Her loved ones were able to intervene in the nick of time and got Sheri admitted to the hospital where she barely escaped with her life.

She was waiting to go back home when she came onto St. Vincent de Paul's radar. Noting that Sheri's house was in complete disarray due to her intense hoarding habits, **our case** managers immediately organized for Sheri's

place to be scrubbed clean, any overdue bills to be paid, new furniture to replace the old, and a ramp to be installed outside.

It was Sheri's birthday when she came home for the first time in months after her harrowing medical ordeal. She was so incredibly moved by the critical aid she had received from SVdP and could not have felt more blessed. **Her life was forever changed.**

As she adjusted to her new home, our case managers continued working with her to ensure she continued her medical treatments and didn't isolate from her circle of care.

St. Vincent de Paul will continue to stand by Sheri's side and those like her for however long they need us. We will always be in your corner with grace and grit to carry you through.



The Unseen Work of our Conferences

St. Vincent de Paul is blessed to have 11 conferences throughout Marin County.

St. Vincent de Paul's St. Anthony's Conference was blessed to assist with the financial needs of a family in desperate need. The compassionate members at St. Anthony's received a call from a woman whose 19-year-old nephew had just arrived in Novato after a harrowing journey on foot all the way from Venezuela. He arrived with nothing but the shirt on his back.

Along the way he had endured blistering heat and drenching rain and even escaped kidnappers to get to the U.S. Arriving at the border, an aid organization helped him make contact with his aunt in Novato who paid his way north.

The St. Anthony's Conference was able to provide him with clothing and a bicycle, so he could search for work. **He called their parishoners** "angels" for helping him in his moment of need.

St. Vincent de Paul's St. Raphael's Conference sprung into action when a struggling family came to them in need. The family, including two young children and a newborn baby, found themselves in financial trouble when the father was forced to take off work to assist his wife in caring for their children while she recovered from a traumatic birth.

To ease their burden during this stressful time, **St. Raphael's partnered with our other conferences to maximise their gift to this young family.** Together, they were able to provide them with a rent check to cover one month, a bag of groceries, a grocery gift card, a baby quilt handmade by a thoughtful parishoner for their newborn, and a Target gift card.

The delightful family was grateful beyond words for the graceful aid of our conference members.

Making Graceful Strides in our Community



St. Vincent de Paul proudly participates in the **Encampment Resolution Program (ERP).** This program works to resolve encampments in Marin County through intensive case management and help in obtaining permanent supportive housing.

This program has seen wonderful success during its tenure at SVdP including an impressive feat of **housing three people in one day** in apartments across Marin. This was done with only two SVdP case managers.

All former residents at the "Snake Path" encampment site in San Rafael have been blessed with a second chance **thanks to donors like BioMarin** who contributed heavily to housing clients residing in this area, along with **you**, our steadfast supporters.

These three immensely grateful clients included Jeffrey, a young man struggling with severe mental health issues and judicial barriers. He had grown up in Marin but fell through the cracks of our community and had been living on the street since his adolescence.

Lydia, in her mid-30s and a former foster child from Marin, was also finally given a place to call home with the aid of SVdP. She had been homeless since the age of only 16.

Lastly was the incredibly appreciative Drake who was dealing with the consequences of a traumatic brain injury that left him jobless and with severe memory issues. In his early 40s, James has found his forever home with SVdP aiding him every step of the way.

These clients have had their lives changed. In true St. Vincent de Paul fashion, they will receive permanent supportive case management services for as long as needed. This accomplishment is monumental in a world where homelessness grows by the day.


People experiencing homelessness most often need rental assistance (77%) or more affordable housing (61%) to get housed on their own.*




